#### **GRAND CANYON: CAPE ROYAL RIM TO RIM**

May 23, 2013

On this trip, I rappelled off of Cape Royal, on the North Rim, descended over days to the Colorado River, hitched a ride on a raft, and hiked up South Kaibab Trail. Not Pictured in this album is the feeling of leaning out on a single strand of webbing, over a cliff, hundreds of feet down, trying to see the bottom, to see if my rope reached, and seeing it snarled in a tree, on a tiny ledge, still 100 feet from the ground.

Not pictured is the sense of exploration, isolation, aloneness, from being where people have never been before, with your emergency locator (SPOT) no longer functioning.

Not pictured is the exhilaration of being on a cliff edge in a wind strong enough to kick me around, throwing a 375 foot rope off the cliff, between gusts, and having the wind throw it right back at me and snarl it up on the cliff just below my feet.

Not pictured is the daily sound of a large rock breaking loose somewhere pounding, echoing, smashing, cascading its way to a bottom somewhere with the world returning to silence, save the beating of a crow's wings passing by.

Not pictured is tying myself off on rappel, pulling myself through a tree-top growing on a tiny ledge, limbby-limb, 150' from the ground, to reach a tangled rope, and having the wind rip me out of the tree, limbs in hand, and swing me out in the air.

Not pictured is the feeling when I pull the first of many ropes down, after rappel, knowing that there is now no going back. I have thousands of feet of cliffs to descend, and I must find a way.

Not pictured are the days of isolation, and now running low on water, headache, heat pressing me, with a 55 pound pack, believing that the signs I'm seeing tell me chances of finding a spring are increasing, but not knowing if I will find one. The feeling of satisfaction of following the many signs that lead me to a spring, not on any map, is almost as sweet as the taste of the water.

Not pictured is my approach to the day's last rappel, in near darkness, down a steep scree slope to a tree on the

edge of a cliff for my anchor, when a rattlesnake rattles in front of me, and I must make it to that tree.

Not pictured is the feeling of having started from Cape Royal, descending 6000 feet of cliffs, slippery scree slopes, brushy, steep, boulder-filled ravines, and suddenly seeing, just as a sliver, between narrow slot canyon walls, the emerald green, fast flowing Colorado River, and knowing that I have now made it from Cape Royal to the River.

Grand Canyon exploration is high risk. This trip was the result of a year of planning, research, working out what I thought was the most likely route to succeed, and an alternate route in case it didn't work (which I ended up taking), and a lot of help from friends and acquaintances in preparation. Do not try such a trip lightly. It will kill you.

But for those with a penchant for staying alive on a great adventure, Life Is Grand.

#### TECHNICAL NOTES:

Gear: 375 ft. of 8.3 mm static rappel rope, 375 ft. of 6 mm pull chord, 160 feet of tan webbing, rap rings (sprayed olive green), one pulley, harness full of tricks, etc., high visibility lime-green and reflective vest, head lamp and SPOT on me at all times.

Rappels: 15 rappels ranging from about 40-300 feet. (13 from Cape Royal to set foot in the creek-bed of upper Vishnu Creek, 2 more to the Colorado River) multiple climb-downs, slide-downs, and occasional "bangdowns". No tent, no sleeping bag. Roll-up camping pad, bivy, Neo-Air mattress.

Ski suit, breathable rain suit, dehydrated food.

The day before this trip, I dropped down the first 3 rappels of this trip, with Deborah, and cached 5 quarts of water, then ascended those ropes back up to Cape Royal. It was a good thing we did.



Alpine Seminar Series - The first Wednesday of each month. We kicked off the Alpine Seminar Series in September with a large group of AMC alpinists.
